May 2013 SRC Bulletin Summary:

Bob Orth, is still away and Vice President, John Johnston, is acting on his behalf.

Larry Basset reported that in spite of repeated reminders, no proposed replacement waiver has been forthcoming. The SRC board, therefore, passed a motion effective immediately to end the extended grace period and all members must have paid their dues AND signed the existing waiver or they will NOT be allowed to shoot. This is a liability issue for the club and we have waited 5 months for a proposed waiver two of our attorney members agreed to draft. We will let you know if this should change.

A pair of new members were sent home and written up after repeated warnings by the Range Safety Officer, for being unable to keep their shots under control, damaging the wood fascias on the 25 yard range, and responding inappropriately to the RSO's orders. **They are no longer members.** Remember you must obey the range safety officer's orders while on the premises or face discipline, no exceptions.

The incident highlights an ongoing problem of damage to the fascias on the 25 yard range when using the 7 yard target frames. Sorry folks, it's just not working, so effective immediately, they will be removed. We will test whether 10 yard target frames will or won't have the damage problem and only leave them in place if the test is successful. We will also add some additional 15 yard target frame holders to the 25 yard range.

The club would like to give thanks to Aaron and Sarah Balian for their quite generous donation of a large quantity of "Core-Plast" – our preferred target backer material. We would also like to thank Tim McGrath for his donation of lots of earplugs.

Juniors Chairman, Mike Furrer, reported completion of the Junior's season and a party planned for May 21st. The Juniors won many trophies and awards at Wenatchee this year, and few of the juniors will leave due to age this year. Next season's kick-off meeting is scheduled for the 2nd Tuesday of September to welcome new member applicants.

The board decided to raise our trap fees for non- members only to \$5 per day and \$4 per line of clay birds, Still less than SVGC. Start of trap shooting on Wednesdays evenings is 5:30 PM for the summer and begins May 22nd and runs through August 7th.

Dave Valandra loaned our backup trap to The **SGC**, who have repaired it inexchange for the loan. The old surplus trap is not yet sold.

A few women have asked for a women's trap shoot like the women's fun pistol shoots. Dave Valandra will investigate.

Shelves for the indoor range are being built and a bid was obtained from Ziggy's for another shed which the board has approved.

The 4WD ATV purchase approved in April was completed. It will be used for general hauling about the premises and for pulling the road grader attachment to save wear and tear on the Husky tractor. It will live in the shed behind the shotgun clubhouse. We have ordered a new 60" door for the shed and Lowell Petersen volunteered to install it.

The 1st High Power match and the Eastern Washington Regionals were held during April.

The ML match that normally would be held on the 2nd Sunday of May was moved to the 3rd Sunday due to Mother's Day.

The first combined BPCR and Class F Match of the year was held on the 1st Sunday in May.

The April women's fun pistol shoot was a success with 28 women participating.

The May on-line Hunter's Education class went well with 30 of 32 applicants passing and the increase in fees plus partial refund succeeded in eliminating the "no-shows." Dave Colton announced Hunter's Education classes will restart the shooting of 22's as part of the live fire portion of Hunter Ed classes and made a motion to use the indoor range for this. The next class is scheduled for September.
